

Hatun Karpay Rightside with Mystic Inka Trail

The Great Initiation, a series of initiations in the fourth level in the mystic side of the tradition, on Inca sanctuaries in Peru, up to the Inca crowning ritual inclusive, passed on by Don Benito Qoriwaman to Don Juan Nuñez del Prado and on to Juan and Ivan to you.

Day 0

Checking in Hotel Libertador. Meeting at 5pm (17:00 hours local time) (possibly at 6pm, ask at hotel reception). Hotel Libertador Cusco *****, Plaza Santo Domingo 120, Tel. 0051(0)84-231961, www.libertador.com.pe. Stay in Cusco.

Day 1

Karpay/Initiate. First initiation in the Cathedral of Cusco. Attending the early mass and connecting with the seventh level through the Black Christ, Señor de los Temblores, and the Holy Virgin. Blending the energies at the Viraqocha Egg and releasing your jucha there.

Trip to Llapata, connection to the ancestors through the Pine trees, making the first connections with the Apus around Cusco and making a despacho to offer to them - through the Wind, expanding to the Apus - as well as one to ask their guidance - through the Sun, contracting their energies. Burning the first despacho on Llapata, the Table of Light. Karpay Ayni with Juan.

Lunch.

Wachay/Being born. Trip to the Cave of Amaru in Machay, in there activate your Inca seed by the exercise of going back to your conception, rejoining your parents in light living energy, and being born again.

Trip to the Lake of Huaskar. After connecting Hanaq Pacha (heaven) in the Cathedral, with Kay Pacha (this world) in Llapata and the cave, now connecting all that to Uju Pacha (underworld) with Inca Huaskar in the lake. Stay in Cusco.

Day 2

Wiñay/Germinate. Trip to Pisac in the Sacred Vally. First sight on the Urubamba River, the Willkañusta for the Inca's, flowing through the Sacred Vally. Germinate your seed in connection with Pisac, the first residence of Inca Pachakuteq where he started his splendid agricultural terras techniques.

Lunch in the Sacred Valley.

Trip to Oyllantaytambo, a contemporary inhabited Inca city, climbing the citadel, performing a ritual with the Wind. Beautiful examples of sequential architectonial periods. Checking into Sonesta Posada del Inca Sacred Valley **** - Yucay, Plaza Manco II, Yucay 123, Tel. 0051(0)84-201107, Fax 0051(0)84-201345, www.sonesta.com/peru_yucay1. Stay in Yucay.

Day 3

Trip to Machupijchu village by train (from Oyllantaytambo only 2-3 hours). Checking in Inkaterra, Machu Picchu Pueblo Hotel ****, Tel. 0051(0)84-245314, www.inkaterra.com. Lunch.

Phutuy/Flower. Going up to the citadel Machupijchu by bus, performing energy-rituals in the temples of Wind and Water, of Sun (the Inti Watana's) and of the Mother Earth. Making a route through the citadel, learning about its functions, meanings, performing energy rituals and finally Flowering the plant in Machupijchu, at the highest point, the Viraqocha stone. Stay in MP hotel.

Day 4

Going up to the citadel Machupijchu by bus, walk down Wayna Pijchu (the mountain behind MP) to the Inca temples, 3 hour hike down&up. First the Temple of Pachamama with the five niches, then the Temple of the Inca with the seven niches, performing very specific energy rituals, connecting with all the niches and altars, energies in five colours and seven spiritual levels. Stay in MP hotel.

Day 5

Climb up Wayna Pijchu (the mountain behind MP), 4 hour hike up&down. On the top connecting all the Apus around MP.

In the evening ritual baths in Las Aguas Calientes Machupicchu, with water that is heated by Pachamama herself. Stay in MP hotel.

Day 6

Willkañusta. In Machupijchu town below, close to where we stayed, working with the river Willkañusta. Willka means highest holiness, black energy, and Ñusta means Princess, refined female energy. This is the Holy River that connects all sacred locations in the Sacred Valley.

Lunch in MP Pueblo. Train or train/bus (4-5 hours) back to Cusco. Stay in Libertador, Cusco.

Day 7

Wañuy/Dying. In Tambo Machay (large niches facing Ausangate) the exercise of dying.

Trip to Sacsayhuaman, the temple complex on this mount looking out over Cusco, build by Inca Pachkuteq - incredible architect - and along with the yanantin temples creating balance with energetic rituals.

Visit to Qorikancha, Golden Palace, the ancient main Inca temple of the Inca Empire (facing your hotel!) where P'unchau was kept, the golden statue representing the Sun God, and all the copies of holy statues of all the nations belonging to the empire. Stay in Cusco.

Day 8

Unu/Become related. Working at Tipon with the Ñusta's, the water spirits in cascades and streams and their refined female energies, being welcomed as part of Inca nobility, become inca relatives by privilege. Also honouring Apu Manuel Pinta opposite Tipon. Stay in Cusco.

Day 9

Trip to the Wiraqocha Temple complex in Raqchi. Crowning ritual in the twelve temples of the twelve royal families, all bringing forth their Qoyllana's (candidates), allowing Viraqocha to choose the next Inca. Weaving ritual with the pillars, cleaning and re-enforcing rituals with the five ñusta's. Two male and two female groupmembers use their misha's to share the energies of the four temples, creating the ultimate energetical balance - Tawantin - in all of us.

Q'ero Paqos make a despacho ceremony to celebrate with us and all of the Kausay Pacha the entire Hatun (Big) Karpay (Initiation) that now is completed.

Stay in Cusco.

Day 10

Flying early from Cusco to Lima, visiting the Pachakamaq temple in Lima, and late in the evening the flight home.
